MEAP Chain of Command & Procedures		

In the case of a **MEDICAL EMERGENCY** please follow the procedures below: -

Escalation of injury Physio/First Aider must escalate the injury immediately to the Medical Lead if they have;

- Any concerns if the player or spectator is in immediate danger to life eg not responsive, bleeding cannot be stopped, head, spinal or neck injury
- If the First Aider needs support or is unsure.
- If the First Aider has multiple injuries to attend to at the same time.

<u>Team</u> Physio/First Aider will be in charge and may ask Team Manager/Administrator/Coach or other responsible adult to call the emergency services 999 or 112

KEY INFORMATION REQUIRED (use the checklist on page 4)

- State your name clearly and that you are acting in your capacity as First Aider or helper.
- Confirm your telephone number if required.
- State exact location of incident. (See above and page 4).
- State type of incident.
- Give details of casualty and approximate age.
- Details of condition from diagnosis (e.g., neck injury, loss of movement in limbs, bleeding, casualty distressed etc).
- Remain calm and stay on the line.

Send someone to go to meet the ambulance and give directions (see above and page 4).

Team Manager/Administrator or Lead Coach to inform parents, next of kin.

Accident/Injury electronic form **MUST** be completed by either Physio/First Aider/Team Manager/Administrator or Lead Coach. (See attached)

Completed form **MUST** be passed on to Rugby Safe Lead (see above).

In the case of a medical emergency that does not require emergency services, ensure that the casualty is accompanied to hospital and that someone remains with them. In the case of Age Grade Rugby please ensure that there are appropriate levels of supervision for the rest of the team members. Children should not travel alone with an adult unless it is their parent/guardian. This applies to HOME and AWAY matches.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

RFU REPORTABLE INJURY EVENTS (Responsibility of Safeguarding officer to report to RFU)

These are defined as:

- An injury which results in the player being admitted to a hospital (this does not include those that attend an Accident or Emergency Department and are allowed home from there).
- Deaths which occur during or within six hours of a game finishing.

Clubs are also required to report injuries in which artificial grass pitches or equipment such as sports goggles are involved.

REPORTABLE INJURY EVENT PROTOCOL

In the event of a serious injury which fulfils one of the above definitions, after providing immediate first aid and arranging transport by ambulance to hospital, the following protocol is to be followed:

- 1. A club Safeguarding officer representative must phone the RFU Injury Reporting Helpline 0800 298 0102, or email SportsInjuriesAdmin@rfu.com as soon as the seriousness of the player's condition is confirmed and certainly within 48 hours of the game or training session.
- 2. In the event of a potentially catastrophic injury or fatality the RFU Injured Players Foundation (IPF) will be notified and will get in touch with the club and/or player (or their family) to confirm the injury and any immediate welfare needs.
- 3. You will be asked to complete and return an injury report form. (See attached).
- 4. Record witness statements. Where a potential insurance or personal injury claim may arise, and retain on file witness statements. These statements must confine themselves to the facts and not include opinion, hearsay or apportion or infer blame. They must be signed and dated by the person making them.

REPORTABLE INJURY EVENTS - REFEREE REPORTS

Following a reportable injury, the referee should also complete Referee Injury Event Form. (See attached).

Other Relevant Information

Team Manager/Administrator or Lead Coach should follow up with injured player or /family and reported to the safeguarding officer.

Make sure that the First Aid kit is restocked after an event.

Replenish your stock of Accident/Injury forms.

In the event of a Medical Emergency call the Emergency Services as quickly as possible on 999/112 giving as many details as possible
